The 12 Books Program is a children's literacy initiative of Mesa United Way that helps to improve literacy among elementary-school children in Mesa through free book distributions, tutoring, and family engagement. Financial and in-kind donations make it possible for us to increase disadvantaged children's access to resources that are crucial for their literacy development and success. Children living in poverty who are not proficient in reading by 3rd grade are three times less likely to graduate from high school than their peers from middle and high-income homes. The amount of age-appropriate books in a child's home and the amount of time children spend reading are critical factors in their literacy development. Donations make it possible for 12 Books to provide these important resources to children in need in Mesa.
